


Now In his late 80's, the legendary investor still lives in a modest home in Omaha, and continues to drive himself to the office every morning to manage Berkshire Hathaway, the fourth-largest public company in the world. But more surprising than his humble lifestyle and self-effacing personality are Buffett's moral integrity and unique mind, which drove him not only to become the most successful businessman in the world, but also an unparalleled philanthropist.

With unprecedented access to his day-to-day personal life, Becoming Warren Buffett tells the improbable story of how an ambitious, numbers-obsessed boy from Nebraska became one of the richest, most-respected men in the world. QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER BEFORE VIEWING THE FILM

The following questions will set the tone for a thoughtful viewing of the film Becoming Warren Buffett. Pick and choose which questions best suit your audience to facilitate a large-group discussion, pre-viewing journaling, or for small-group dialogue.

- Who is a person who has inspired you to be the best version of yourself? How did this person inspire you – by example? Tough love? Or another way?
- Think of a time when you suffered a great disappointment. Was there a "silver lining" to this experience? A benefit that you wouldn't have had, if you hadn't been disappointed? Explain.
- Who was one of the greatest teachers you've had in your life? What did this person teach you?
- Can you think of a time or experience in your life that you'd consider a "turning point?" What was this experience, and why was it so important to your life so far?
- There is a saying, "the chains of habit are too light to notice until they're too heavy to break." What does this quote mean, and what does it mean to you?
- What is your biggest fear? How does this fear limit your potential for success?
- Who is your community, and what does "community" mean to you?
- What does money mean to you? What does financial success mean to you?
- In your opinion, what is the relationship between wealth and ethics?



QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER AFTER VIEWING THE FILM

After the film concludes, use some or all of the following questions to guide a thoughtful debrief. Depending on the setting and size of your group, you can use these questions to facilitate a whole-group dialogue, conversation in smaller break-out groups, as a supplement to assigned reading, or for homework or extended learning.

- What makes Warren Buffett "not your usual billionaire?"
- What is compounding? How does Buffett apply the concept of compounding to his business dealings? How does he apply this same concept to his relationships and philanthropic endeavors? Explain compounding as a mathematical concept – and then consider how it can be interpreted as a philosophical idea and applied to life in general.
- What impact did school, and individual teachers both formal and informal have on Warren Buffett's personal and professional development?
- What is the importance of community to Warren Buffett? How does this relate to his business philosophy, his attitude about family, and his approach to philanthropy? How has it affected his success?
- What is the "circle of competence?" How has Buffett used this in his business dealings? How can you apply this to your own life?
- In the film, Buffett quotes a speech by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., which is actually quoting the writer James Russell Lowell: "Truth forever on the scaffold, Wrong forever on the throne, Yet that scaffold sways the future." How do you interpret the meaning of this phrase? What did it mean to MLK, Jr.? What does it mean to Buffett?
- What are Warren Buffett's attitudes about civil rights? About women's rights? How did he come to these attitudes?
- How does Warren Buffett spend his time on a daily basis? How do these habits affect his life as a businessman? As a father? As a humanitarian?

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QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER AFTER VIEWING THE FILM (cont.)

- How would you describe Warren Buffett's reputation? How does this reputation help him succeed in business?
- What happened shortly after Buffett acquired a large share of Solomon Brothers?
 How did he personally manage this crisis?
- Discuss this quote within the context of Warren Buffett's biography:
 - "It's a very strange thing, love, you can't get rid of it. Give it out you get more back. Try to hang on to it, and you lose it."
- Do you think Warren Buffett will be remembered first as a businessman or as a humanitarian? Explain.
- Choose one of the following quotes and discuss how the statement relates to Buffett's financial success:
 - A. "Those who have the least in this world should benefit from those who have the most."
 - B. "Don't sleep through life. Look for the job that you'd take if you didn't need a job. Do what you love."
 - C. "I have been asked immeasurable times what I would like inscribed on my tombstone. I always answer with a single word: 'teacher.'"
